WHAT IS PROGRAM EVALUATION?

Program evaluation is part of the Ten Essential Public Health Services (essential service #9) and a necessary step to assess the output and outcomes of a given program. This helps us to gauge what is working, so we can make decisions on how to allocate our resources wisely. It allows us to determine a program's quality, effectiveness, and impact, ultimately providing the feedback necessary for continued improvement.

WHY IS PROGRAM EVALUATION IMPORTANT?

Program evaluation is necessary to

- 1. Assess and improve quality
 - 2. Determine effectiveness

Without this we cannot determine whether or not our program is working towards our goals, or achieving our intended objectives.

PROCESS VS OUTCOME EVALUATION

Process evaluation focuses on the quality of program performance and delivery what are the products. Outcome evaluation focuses on the ultimate results or impact of a program.

Goals and Objectives

- Goals and objectives **provide the basis for program evaluation;** is our program advancing our goals and objectives like we intended?
- Goals are more **general, long-term,** and not always measurable
- Objectives **should always** be measurable and timely

GOALS

Describes long-range intent in clear and concise terms. Provides guidance for the program and is supported by objectives.

OBJECTIVES

Small steps intended to advance program goal(s). Program benchmarks that are measurable - monitors specific change.

SMART OBJECTIVES

Program objectives should be SMART

- **Specific** does this objective target a specific change/outcome for the priority population?
- **Measurable** Are we able to measure the products/outcomes from this objective?
- Attainable Is this objective actually attainable; can we achieve what we set out to do?
- **Realistic** Is achieving this objective within the realm of what is realistic in terms of timeline, capacity, etc?
- **Timely** Does this objective contain a set time for when we expect to see results?
