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

We seek to advance the skills of the current and **future** public health workforce to improve population health outcomes.

Student field placements and collaborative projects allow students to collaborate with practice agencies on capacity building projects that support their work in addressing the social determinants of health.

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Who should consider applying?

Students with...

- A defined project at a placement site
 - Placement begins May 2023
- An unpaid opportunity
- Who meet the eligibility criteria

...are encouraged to apply!

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Eligibility Criteria

- Health professions student (public health, nursing, social work, psychology, sociology)
 - NEW: Tribal Community College students enrolled in a health professions degree program (e.g. allied health, CHW) are eligible
- Undergraduate juniors or seniors, masters students, and doctoral students
- US citizens, nationals, or permanent residents of US*
- Cannot receive funding more than once

 $\verb|*DACA|| recipients and international students with work/research/student visas are not eligible for these federal funds.$

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Placement Site and Project Priorities

- Medically underserved community and/or rural area
- Preference for governmental public health sites
- Projects designed to enhance public health services and/or address the social determinants of health
- Project duration: typically last 3+ months
- Hours minimum:
 - Undergrad: 150 hoursGraduate: 200 hours



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Project Types

Field Placements

- Individual students
- Projects done with a public health organization located in or serving a medically underserved community
- Builds organizational capacity to address social determinants of health

Collaborative Projects

- Projects are similar in type and setting as field placement projects
- Involve individual or groups of students
- Include faculty involvement

For MPH students at CEPH-accredited institutions, it is possible that these activities could help fulfill their Applied Practice Experience requirement. Either type of experience might also fulfill an internship requirement per their institution's guidelines.

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Program Requirements

- Student Evaluations (4)
 - o Baseline
 - Mid-point
 - Post
 - o 1-year follow-up
- HRSA Deliverable (1)
 - o Scientific poster
 - o Scientific report



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Summer CoP Programming

- Community of Practice (CoP):
 - Has a shared concern, passion, and purpose
 - Opportunity to learn from peers and improve current practices
 - o Works together to solve common problems in certain focus areas
- All program components occur virtually or are available online, and consist of:
 - Live sessions (3)
 - Orientation, Entering/Exiting Communities, and Adaptive Leadership (May)
 - Networking (June)
 - Reflection and Next Steps (August)
 - Asynchronous (self-paced) programming (July)
 - Mini-tutorials
 - Other recorded, curated training
 - o Participate in a LinkedIn discussion board &/or write a blog post


Students who complete 80% of program components above, along with the deliverable and surveys, will earn a certificate of completion.

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Benefits of Funding and Programming Support

Stipend

- \$3,500 per student*
- Paid in 2 installments of \$1,750 each at start and end of project

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Application Information & Timeline

- Applications opened: March 1, 2023
 - Apply here: https://www.rvphtc.org/student-projects/
 - o NOTE: You will need to upload a letter of confirmation from your site preceptor.
- Application period closes: 11:59pm EST on Sun., April 16, 2023
- Review of applications: April 17 28
 - Two individuals will review each application using a rubric, scoring for eligibility and thoroughness of completion
- Notifications of accepted applications: Mon., May 1, 2023

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
